As you, therefore, have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. --Colossians 2:6-7

In this passage, Paul hearkens back to the early days of the Christian mission to the people at Colossae. He writes to them out of uncertainty over whether they will stay firmly connected to Christ Jesus the Lord, or whether they will drift away. This is his chief concern. Paul perceives them to be in a moment the Bible calls a "Kyros moment." It's a moment that is critical. It is a time when much can be gained, but also much can be lost. Indeed, Paul is concerned that the Colossians will lose everything if they lose Christ Jesus the Lord. He draws on several images to help ground them where they are.

They are rooted.

They are built up.

They are established.

We too are rooted, people. Rooted in the gospel of Jesus Christ. Rooted in the creation and bound to it. Rooted in a place where the active and alive Holy Spirit can animate us in marvelous ways.

We too are built up. That word evokes the image of a building that is taking shape as it is gradually being constructed. We are a work in progress. The good news is that God has and continues to build upon us. Something that is true in normal times. Something that is especially true in COVID times. And just like when a building is built, there often are revelations that take place. Revelations that reveal the intent of the architect before it all began. I feel that we too are in a time of revelation as our building up continues. Let us be delighted and surprised at what takes shape.

We too are established. In the Bible, that word is a legal word and it alludes to a contract that has been ratified and made binding. It speaks of an enduring relationship and enduring commitment that will outlast the storms of persecution and doubt.

In times like these, it's good to remember how we have been rooted, and built up, and established since the very beginning of the mission here in Baxter, Minnesota. It's important to remember what truly matters from our heritage when so much of what we had taken for granted in our life together - we no longer. Since the very beginning, people have mattered. We have sought to be family together.

Which makes it all the more painful for me to share with you the sad news that our own Colleen - a beloved presence in our office - has informed me of her intent to resign effective July 3rd. We wish her well in her new endeavor and are "Abounding in Thanksgiving" for all that she brought to our staff and congregation. She will be greatly missed.





UNSEEN BUT *active*

This experiment illustrates that although God is invisible, we can see his work all around us.



What you need:

- Drinking glass
- Water
- Index card


What you do:

1. Practicing over a sink, fill the glass halfway with water. Then press the index card snugly atop the glass with one hand.
2. With the other hand, hold the base of the glass and carefully flip it over.
3. Remove your hand from the card. It should stay on the glass, without spilling the water! The invisible air in the glass creates a suction with the card, preventing the water from spilling out. Research air pressure to learn more.
4. After perfecting the trick, amaze others with it. Then talk about how God, like the air in the glass, is unseen but active.

LORD OF LIFE'S STEPHEN MINISTRY IS ONE YEAR OLD

Please join me in thanking God for our five Stephen Ministers:
Wendy Adamson, Deb Cervantez, Pam Cook, Gary Engelmann, Julie Johnson

These faithful and faith-filled members of our faith family were commissioned as Stephen Ministers one year ago, on June 23, 2019, and have been meeting with and caring for their care receivers generously since then.

In Matthew 18, Jesus promises to be with us. That's one of the great miracles of Stephen Ministry. When a Stephen Minister meets one-to-one with his or her care receiver, Jesus is present too – yes, even during the necessary social distancing due to COVID-19. Jesus brings the power of his transforming love to the care receiver through the caregiver, as well as the peace, healing, and comfort that only God can give. One of the slogans of Stephen Ministry is, "We are the caregivers, God is the CUREgiver." Lord of Life is blessed by the work of our Stephen Ministers, and we are so grateful for them!

Below is a collection of anonymous statements from around the world from folks who have benefitted from the care of a Stephen Minister:

"I thank God every day for my Stephen Minister. I don't know how I could have made it through the past year without her!"

"Before I had a Stephen Minister, I struggled with whether I even believed in God. Now I have seen God's love face-to-face through my Stephen Minister. It has been life changing."

"I was ready to give up. But my Stephen Minister wouldn't let me. He kept encouraging me and gave me the motivation to keep going."

"Stephen Ministry really made a difference for me. I'd encourage anyone going through a tough time to consider asking for a Stephen Minister."

"I was alone and had no one to turn to. Then I heard about Stephen Ministry. My Stephen Minister became a friend I could really count on."

"I was hurting so much I couldn't see straight. But I discovered the healing love of Jesus through my Stephen Minister. I can't say enough about Stephen Ministry!"

"As a man, I found it difficult and awkward to reach out for help, but I'm glad I did. I probably could have made it alone, but it sure was a lot easier having a Stephen Minister to talk to."

"I felt guilty about being angry at God, but my Stephen Minister didn't think I was terrible. He was very patient and just listened and cared. He demonstrated Jesus' unconditional love and helped me to trust God again."

"The best thing about Stephen Ministry was that it was so confidential. Nobody even knew I had a Stephen Minister."

"I had never felt so alone as after my wife died. I had never opened up to anyone else before. My Stephen Minister helped me work through the painful feelings and helped me find hope again."

"I was able to tell my Stephen Minister things I could never have told a friend. And she never judged me or looked down on me. She just listened and cared. It was just what I needed."

Greetings Lord of Life Family,

As I'm sure many of us are longing for the day when we can get back together, I admire all of you for your caring, helping out when you can, and for praying for our country and world. One of June's Health Observation topics is Migraine headaches, which many people experience.

More than 37 million Americans suffer from migraines. This vascular headache is most commonly experienced between the ages of 15 and 55, and 70% to 80% of sufferers have a family history of migraines. Less than half of all migraine sufferers have received a diagnosis from their healthcare provider. Migraines are often misdiagnosed as sinus headaches or tension-type headaches.

Many factors can trigger migraine attacks, such as alteration of a sleep-wake cycle; missing or delaying a meal; medications that cause swelling of the blood vessels; daily or near-daily use of medications designed for relieving headache attacks; bright lights, sunlight, fluorescent lights, TV and movie viewing; certain foods; and excessive noise. Stress and/or underlying depression are important trigger factors that can be diagnosed and treated adequately. Approximately one-fifth of migraine sufferers experience an aura, the warning associated with migraine, before the headache pain. Visual disturbances such as wavy lines, dots, or flashing lights and blind spots begin from twenty minutes to one hour before the actual onset of a migraine.

Migraine without Aura

- At least five headache attacks, lasting 4-72 hours
- One-side, pulsating pain of moderate-to-severe intensity
- Aggravated by or causing avoidance of routine physical activity
- Accompanied by at least 1 of the following
 - Nausea and/or vomiting
 - Photophobia (hypersensitivity to or avoidance of light)
 - Phonophobia (hypersensitivity to or avoidance of sound)

Migraine with Aura

- Is accompanied by at least 1 of the following, which resolve completely:
 - Visual symptoms (eg, flickering lights, spots, or lines) or vision loss
 - Sensory symptoms (eg, pins and needles or numbness)
 - Speech disturbance (difficulty putting words together)

Common Symptoms

- Before or during a migraine attack
 - The feeling of well-being or surge of energy
 - Talkativeness or restlessness
 - Increased appetite
 - Drowsiness or depression
 - Irritability or tension
- During a migraine attack
 - Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea
 - Sweating or cold hands
 - Sensitivity to light or sounds
 - Scalp tenderness or pressure
 - Pale facial color
 - Pulsing pain

I hope you have found this useful, many people suffer from Migraines and I hope this helps to explain it a little better.


Please accept this letter as a formal notice that I will be resigning from my position at Lord of Life effective July 3 due to an opportunity that presented itself to me.


