## ***Pastor Steven Rye's Annual Report***

Paul writes; "we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." - Romans 5:3-5

Recently, I visited with a gentleman who wishes to join our congregation. We talked about where he had come from and his involvement there. Among other things, he had volunteered in an oncology department of a hospital. He reflected on his experience, "What I find so fascinating is the wide range of ways that people enter into their chemo treatment. Some with a great life spirit, others with deep dread and everything in between." Over my years in ministry, I have found this to be so true. Those with a great life spirit tend to be people who have GRATITUDE and a spirit of HOPE.

Where does one even begin to report on all that has taken place since our last Annual Meeting? This year has seemed like one big - long - treatment. Like many in treatment that I have been inspired by over the years, I find myself with a tremendous life spirit filled with gratitude and a spirit of hope.

First of all, I am so grateful for

my Lord of Life family. For so many people and their efforts through it all. I'm grateful for our new Communication Coordinator, Tyler Jensen, who filled a huge gap on our staff that opened up when Colleen left. He has quickly become an essential part of the team. I'm also grateful for the rest of the staff. There is a wonderful team spirit among us, they have tremendous servant-hearts, and as a congregation, we are blessed to have them. I'm grateful too for so many members who have stepped up in so many ways, from the quiet heroes who continue to financially support our congregation to those who have stepped up to ensure our vital ministry continues.

Despite the shutdown of so much of what we do, we were still able to hold Master Classes, First Communion, and Confirmation. We have been able to sustain the effort of putting out prayerLIFE@12:45 devotionals, Christmas Eve and Easter Kits. Other things that fill me with gratitude: The Advent lights and patio prayer station, Participating in the national COVID memorial, The spawning of a new ministry group: "Friends of Baxter Elementary," and recently our Mother's Day hymn sing.

As we move forward, I am HOPEFUL we will continue work to recalibrate and right-size our staff for growth and congregational vitality. We will leverage the skills of our new Communication Coordinator to communicate in this ever-more complicated world effectively.

Online and in-building programming and worship will continue and expand. We also need to provide thoughtful in-reach to current members.

I am hopeful we will steward our "COVID reset" well through examining our past practices in light of our new environment. We are discerning what will meet the needs of the un-churched or the de-churched and reclaiming a hunger for outreach. As more and more ministries come back online, we will be intentional about starting them off on the right foot - supported by our mission-oriented council.

Finally, I am HOPEFUL we will stay on a firm organizational footing. Then we will build upon the mission-oriented culture change taking place within the congregational and the council. I am hopeful we will remain fiscally sound through the cultivation of generosity.

How am I hopeful in these days after our "treatment"? Because, as Romans 3 tells us, "We live in the assurance that our hope does not disappoint us because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us."

Thank you for allowing the Holy Spirit to be a conduit for God's love poured out into the world! And thank you for your partnership in ministry!

# Synod Assembly

The ELCA's Northeastern Minnesota Synod's annual assembly was held Friday, April 30 - Saturday, May 1 online. Salem Lutheran Church in Hermantown hosted the physical aspects of the Assembly.

Lord of Life's representatives included Jim and Teresa Kingsley and Sarah Meier, the Synod Assembly Representatives, while Pastors Steve and Erika also attended.

The ELCA's Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton delivered the keynote address, where she recognized work being done in the Synod. These included the work being done by the Together Here / Anti-Racism Team to build relationships with Native American communities. The Northeastern Minnesota Synod is neighbors with five federally recognized tribal reservations.

Bishop Eaton also touched on the partnership with Lutheran Social Service (LSS). The organization's services impact 1 out of 50 people in the United States. She also spoke about the ELCA Covid Relief Fund, which has provided extra financial help to ministries throughout the Church, including Lutheran Outdoor Ministry, which partners with our Synod.

The Assembly passed the 2022 Budget totalling about \$1.17 million, up from \$1.16 million in 2020.

In three ballots, Sanna Berdahl was elected Youth/Young Adult voting member. Micah Johnson was elected as the alternate.

LSS presented the Servant of Christ Award to First Lutheran, Kenwood Lutheran and Lutheran Church of the Good Sheperd all of Duluth, for their work sewing more than 4,000 face masks to help with the pandemic.

The 2022 Synod Assembly will be held April 29 - May 1, 2022 at Cragun's Resort here in the Brainerd Lakes Area.
