Waking Up White and Finding Myself in the Story of Race

I don't think I ever said anything nasty to a person of color. But I know that many people of color hear evil things spoken to them all the time.

I believe that people of color are every bit as good as me, a white Scandinavian American. But I know that many in my world think people of color are somehow less worthy members of society.

I believe that people of color deserve equity – justice, fair play, impartiality – a chance to catch up after generations, even centuries of experiencing injustice and persecution.

We can't change the past - slavery, Jim Crow laws, lynchings, stolen Indigenous land, broken treaties, plagues, massacres, Indian boarding schools . . . But, we, I can make a difference today and on into the future. Jesus confirmed that the greatest and second greatest commandments are "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart . . . soul . . . strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." (Luke 10:27) The Preamble to the Declaration of Independence says, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." I believe that both scripture and constitution call for me to speak out for justice.

Therefore, I would love to invite you to join Lolly Kalinoski and I as we lead a five-week book study on "Waking Up White and Finding Myself in the Story of Race," by Debby Irving. The study will meet on 2nd and 4th Sundays, beginning January 9, 10:15 a.m. The group will meet at Lord of Life and also enable people to participate remotely via Zoom. Free books are available first come first served or you can order online. The first session will be an introductory discussion and the following sessions will dig into the text. Come once and see what you think. This study is being sponsored by the Micah Group which has been gradually forming at Lord of Life.

How much do you know about racism? This study will be a chance for us to learn a little more about the world we all share. It may also be a chance to learn how to love the neighbor of color in some very real ways. 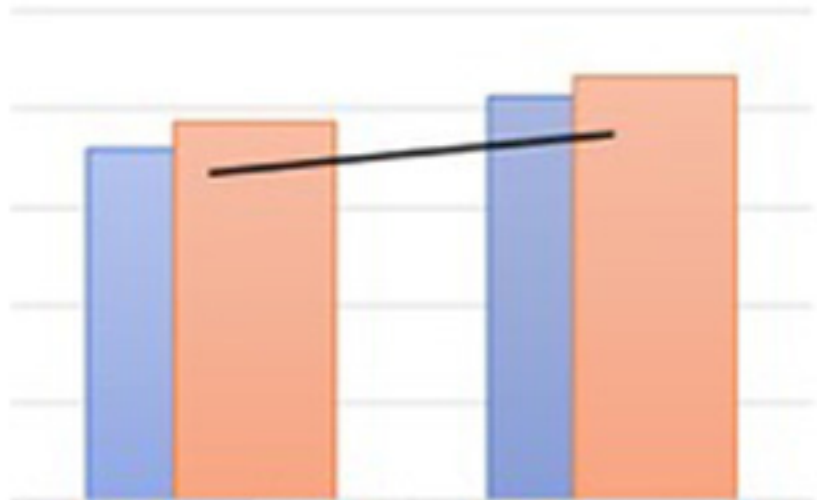
