So I started watching! Oddly, the only season available on my Delta flight was season 11. So that's where I started. And Season 11 starts with Easter. What a wonderful place to start – when everything is possible and hope emerges everywhere.

And as I finished watching almost the whole of Season 11, thankful that I got lost in these wonderful characters and stories, I found myself wondering if this Easter we might simply get lost! Might we get lost in hope – or as the beautiful last line of the hymn "Love Divine, All Love's Excelling" puts it, "lost in wonder, love and praise?" Might we get lost in all of the hope and possibility and wonder of resurrection – and not just for 1 day, but for the whole of the Easter season, or maybe even for the whole of our lives?

As followers of Jesus we know that the promise of Easter is the hope that God is at work in and through all that we experience in life. As followers of Jesus we know that the promise of Easter is the wonder that new life is possible in the most unlikely of places and spaces.

As followers of Jesus we know that the promise of Easter is that the power of love will always and ultimately infuse the world – rolling away stones, transforming hearts, renewing the creation.

May we get lost in such promises and live in such possibility and may hope emerge everywhere!


Pr. Nilsen: Lent at Lord of Life will offer opportunities for reflection and prayer.


