My nephew/godson graduated from high school this summer and when I finally had a chance to see him and celebrate with him in July, when our whole family gathered at my parents' home in Des Moines for a family reunion, I shared this prayer with him. It seems so fitting for one who is just embarking on a new adventure – unsure of what the future will bring – and not always so sure about who is with him on the journey. Oh God, please be the hand that leads him . . .

At the same time, the prayer was embraced by my mom and dad, who, at 84 and 85 are at a very different juncture on their life journey than their grandson who is 18. Yet, they too, are facing a rather unknown future that feels peppered with perils and difficult paths to walk. Their bodies are aging fast, their mobility is shifting, their ability is lessening. Oh God, please give them good courage . . .

And for my siblings and I, I could see us each clinging to the words of this prayer our own lives – all of us in middle age – with changing circumstances with work and children and "where do we want to live when we retire" and "will there ever be enough money to retire" and "will our adult children be ok" and "what will aging parents demand of us?" Oh God, please give us faith when we cannot see our way through...

It made me realize just how often I have prayed this prayer. This prayer has accompanied me for much of my life in ministry and I



have often leaned into it and upon it – especially when I was scared or overwhelmed and when I could not even come up with the words to pray.

I wonder – what do you lean into and upon when you are scared and overwhelmed and unsure of what the future will bring? What is the prayer of your heart? Where do you find solace and strength amidst the perils and winding paths and darker moments of life?

One of the reasons I love to gather for worship each and every week is that I am once again reminded and assured that yes, this venture of life is complex and unknown and mysterious and gorgeous and tender and wild and surprising and painful and delightful and it is a venture to which we have all been called and have the privilege of walking together in all of its wondering and bewilderment. And for the journey God's love is supporting us and God's hand is leading us and in that we can be confident!

Life Groups

Would you consider answering the call to join a LIFEgroup starting in October?

John 10:10 reads, "I came that you may have LIFE and have it abundantly." We know that in Christ, we are promised a life that is deep and rich and that we can encounter any circumstance that comes our way with trust and hope. We also know that the LIFE that Christ has in mind for us – the abundant life he speaks of in this simple verse is more fully experienced in the community – while walking alongside others!

LIFEgroups consist of no more than ten adults covenanting to connect eight times beginning in October. LIFEgroups will spend time together in fellowship, in reflection on a chapter or a topic, and a time of prayer. The time you spend together in your LIFEgroup will be time committed to deepening and enriching your fellow members, the community around you, and Christ. In order to help ensure the vitality of each group, one member from your group will be asked to attend an organizational meeting on Sunday, October 1.

Signup begins on September 17th - Rally Sunday.

We suggest one of these books for your group:

Whisper - How to Hear the Voice of God by Mark Batterson - Here's a description taken from the Amazon page: "Many people have a tough time believing God still speaks. Sure, in ancient times and mysterious ways, God spoke to His people, but is He still speaking now? Mark Batterson certainly believes so. And he wants to introduce you to the seven love languages of God, each of them unique and entirely divine. Some of them you might suspect, but others will surprise you. By learning to tune in to and decipher each language, you'll be able to hear His guidance in simple and life-altering choices. God actively speaks through Scripture, Desires, Doors, Dreams, People, Promptings, and Pain. Batterson gives you the tools you need to unlock each of these languages. God's whisper can answer your burning questions, calm your deepest fears, and fulfill your loftiest dreams. Discover how simple it is to hear God's voice in every aspect of your life! He's speaking; make sure you know how to listen!"

The Four Things That Matter Most by Ira Brock - Amazon depicts the book this way: "This beautiful book, full of wisdom and warmth, teaches us how to protect and preserve our most valuable possessions—the relationships with those we love. It shows that the things that matter aren't 'things,' and how to empower your life in the right direction." —Dr. Stephen R. Covey, author of The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People

Questions God Asks Us, by Trevor Hudson - This book contains 10 biblical stories where God asks the biblical characters questions. Again, from Amazon: "Transformation comes from questions, not answers. We often look to the Bible as the book of answers. How often, though, do we consider the challenging questions God asks? Hudson notes that Jesus was asked 183 questions in the Gospels but directly only answered three. The Creator teaches us as we teach children when they struggle with schoolwork: You learn more by doing than by being fed an absolute answer. In Questions God Asks Us, we're encouraged to focus on the quest rather than a resolution. Such an approach leads to deeper dialogue and intimacy with the divine. This is a critical turning point in our journey with God--as it was for the author.

Micah Group

On August 20th at 11:00 a.m. (after our regular church service) we will have the opportunity to hear Destiny Brown do a presentation entitled Changing the Narrative. This is open to the entire congregation and presented by the Micah Group.

Talking about mental health and suicide can be an uncomfortable and uncertain topic that brings up different feelings, beliefs, and attitudes for everyone. Changing the Narrative is an interactive conversation that empowers participants to change their perceptions of mental health towards hope and resilience.

The goal is to know that help is available, suicide can be preventable, and healing is possible. The presentation covers the eight dimensions of wellness, group discussion about mental health, why it matters and how to talk about it, as well as touching on suicide prevention and resources available.

This session is to engage participants to think about their own mental health, as well as helping to change the narrative on mental health within the community.

Participants will:

• Understand the importance of language surrounding Mental Health and Suicide;

- Reflect on Eight Dimensions of Wellness;
- · Identify risk and protective factors;
- · Feel empowered to respond to someone in distress; and

• Discuss feelings, beliefs, and attitudes while talking about Mental Health and Suicide.

Destiny Tinnes (Brown) has worked in the mental health field for over five years. She works for Northern Pines Mental Health Center as the North Central MN Suicide Prevention Regional Coordinator. She is an advocate for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. Destiny is a suicide loss survivor with a passion for suicide prevention, as well as working with law enforcement regarding suicide prevention/intervention.


