On Sunday, October 8th Lord of Life will celebrate Indigenous People's Sunday. It is an opportunity for our congregation to acknowledge and honor the rich cultural history of Indigenous Peoples throughout this country and recognize their valuable contributions to our community.

For many of us, we grew up learning the phrase "In 1492, Columbus sailed the ocean blue". We say he "discovered" America. The truth is that Indigenous Peoples had lived here for tens of thousands of years before his arrival. Unfortunately, European contact resulted in devasting loss of life, disruption of traditions and an enormous loss of lands for Indigenous peoples in the Americas. It is estimated that in the 130 years following first contact, Native America lost 95% of its population. *

For most of us that is an astonishing fact. As we reflect on history and the impact of Indigenous Peoples as a part of our lives and our community, you are invited to consider a land acknowledgement statement developed by a group called the ACEs Resiliency Coalition. It might be a springboard for further thought.

ACEs Resiliency Coalition Land Acknowledgement

"Every community owes its existence and vitality to generations from around the world who contributed their hopes, dreams, and energy to making the history that led to this moment. Some were brought here against their will; some were drawn to leave their distant homes in hope of a better life, and some have lived on this land for more generations than can be counted. Truth and acknowledgement are critical to building mutual respect and connections across all barriers of heritage and difference.

We begin this effort to acknowledge what has been buried by honoring the truth. We are standing on the ancestral lands of the Dakota and Ojibwe people. We pay respect to their elders past and present. Please take a moment to consider the treaties made by the Tribal Nations that entitle non-native people to live and work on traditional Native lands. Consider the many legacies of violence, displacement, migration and settlement that bring us together here today. Please join us in uncovering such truths at any and all such public events."



Worship in September

This month will see an incredible amount of activity on Sundays! First and foremost is that starting September 17th, we will be returning to offering two Sunday worship services.

The first will be at 8:30 am and feature a tradition worship service order, taken from the red ELW hymnals. Our first traditional service will feature the Lord of Life Choir! To fully immerse ourselves in that traditional feeling, we will be rolling out paper bulletins for this service. These include the service's readings, prayer concerns for the week, a table of contents for the service, and more.

With this, we will need volunteers to help fold bulletins each week. Please let Tyler know if you can help fold on Thursday afternoons.

The 10:30 am services will be more contemporary, using newer Christian music while also doing new takes on old favorites. One thing that will change with this service is that we will hand out prayer cards as you enter, and invite you to list things we should pray for during the service.

In between these two services will be a Community Hour. Here you can relax and enjoy a time of fellowship with one another or attend an educational event. We invite those coming to the traditional service to stay later and those coming to the contemporary service to come early and share this time.

On September 17th, our first Community Hour is a ministry fair, where you can learn more about the different ministries and groups here at Lord of Life. Future Community Hours will include Bible Studies, theological discussions, recreational events and more.

Our first community hour on Sunday, September 17th will be a time to learn more about the different ministries at Lord of Life during our annual Ministry Fair. Following the 10:30 am service, we invite every-one to enjoy a fun picnic to celebrate Rally Sunday.

Our final Sunday with just one service is September 10. Following this service we will celebrate the ELCA event God's Work, Our Hands. Here we will be the hands and feet of Jesus, volunteering at three sites around the community.

Our sites for this year are The Bridge on 7th Warming Shelter, The Alex and Brandon Child Safety Center, and the Northland Arboretum.

At the Alex and Brandon Center and the Northland Arboretum we will be doing work outdoors such as gardening, painting, and other yard work. At the Bridge on 7th, we will help staff prepare the shelter for their opening for the season.
