During Lent, our sermon series focused on the message of unity: "That all may be one" (John 17:21). This theme extended to a discussion on communion and our current practice of welcoming everyone to the table, except children under the 5th grade.

communion stems from a historical practice of delaving communion until confirmation. This practice was influenced by a verse in 1 Corinthians that warns against failing to recognize the "body of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:29).

However, another passage

in 1 Corinthians describes the "body of Christ" as the our Christian education proentirety of the congregation, each member playing a vital role (1 Corinthians 12:27). This perspective suggests that the passage may not be referring to the physical elements of bread and wine.
