The Good News at **Lord of Life** October 2024

As we kicked off another year of Confirmation ministry this Fall, we leaned into our theme Build Us Up, Lord! And because confirmation is FUN, we built a tower as we talked about why we do what we do in confirmation!

Our tower started (as do our lives and God's church) with a strong foundation. Our foundation of faith is formed in our Baptism and then built upon through the baptismal promises that parents make to their children! In our baptism, God CLAIMS US as God's very own, NAMES US beloved. and promises to REMAIN WITH US forever

This promise comes from love, is poured out in forgiveness and experienced in unconditional inclusion and that is grace indeed!. That's where we start! That's our foundation! And then the Spirit of Christ builds from there!

We are built up through the practices of the faith - through participation in worship, receiving the sacraments, dwelling in community with other believers, learning and living God's word, and growing in the basics tenets of the faith




